

Wellness/Medical Exam

Did you know that there is a difference between a wellness vision exam and a medical eye exam? A wellness vision exam includes a screening for eye disease and an eye refraction. If you wish to receive a glasses or contact lens prescription at your next visit, you should notify the appointment scheduler that you would like to book a wellness vision exam. A medical eye exam typically includes diagnosis and treatment of eye related medical diseases, such as glaucoma, macular degeneration, cataracts, corneal disease, eye infections, dry eye, etc. If the intention for your visit is to be evaluated for a medical eye condition, then notify us.



Intraocular Lens

If you or someone you know needs cataract surgery, ask about our premium intraocular lenses. These include multifocal and toric astigmatism correcting lenses. These artificial lenses help cataract patients see well at various distances after surgery, often decreasing their dependence on glasses or contacts.
